participate in the “iBuckleUP, weBuckleUP” campaign, and received training from top traffic safety efforts at the National Cluster Meeting held in Washington DC. These students are applying what they learned in Washington DC and will complete service projects in the community to educate others about the importance of seatbelt use. Students have already conducted a pre-assessment to determine how many students and parents currently use their seatbelt.

The members sold watermelon ices, SDSU raspberry revel ice-cream, a basket filled with pink items for a raffle, chuck a duck, and breast cancer awareness bracelets. The Redfield FCCLA chapter also involved the high school art classes to help promote Pink night at the game. Pink cancer awareness t-shirts were also sold. The money that was raised was given to a lady in the community fighting breast cancer. The Redfield FCCLA Dodgeball for Diabetes Tournament was held November 16. The night was flurry of flying dodgeballs as audience members gasped and cheered. The winning team earned a pizza party. A 50/50 raffle was held during the tournament as well. All funds raised will go to benefit Camp Gilbert. Camp Gilbert welcomes more than 100 campers with Type I Diabetes between the ages of 8 to 18 for one week each summer. Camp Gilbert has been held at NeSoDak Camp on Lake Enemy Swim each summer for 25 years, and it is one of the few camps in the country that welcomes high school aged kids too. Redfield FCCLA and FACS classes gave back to the community for Thanksgiving. Prior to Thanksgiving, a donation of bananas from the Redfield Food Center was given to the Redfield FCCLA Chapter. With this donation, 130 small loaves of banana bread was made and donated to the local food pantry to be placed in the Thanksgiving baskets. At the November Jr. FCCLA meeting, members made polar fleece tie blankets for National Family Week. These blankets will be given to the Ronald McDonald House.
